Xbox One

- 1. Press the Menu button on your controller, select Settings, and then select Network.
- 2. Select advanced settings
- 3. Use Wireless Mac address

Xbox X/S

- 1. Find My Xbox in the Xbox Dashboard and select Settings
- 2. Under General, Select Network Settings
- 3. Select Advanced Settings from the Network Settings tab
- 4. You will see the MAC address for Wire and Wireless, choose Wireless (Wi-Fi)

Sony PlayStation 4

- 1. Turn on your Playstation 4 without any disk in the drive and wait for the menu to pop up.
- 2. Navigate to the "Settings" icon (located on the far left).
- 3. Select the "System" icon under the Settings menu.
- 4. Select "System Information."
- 5. Write down your "MAC Address (Wi-Fi)."

Sony PlayStation 5

- 1. Go to "Settings"
- 2. Select System Software, Select Console Information
- 3. You will see the MAC address for both LAN and Wi-Fi -- choose the Wi-fi

Nintendo Switch

- 1. From the HOME menu, highlight and select the System Settings Icon.
- 2. Select "Internet Settings."
- 3. Tap "Other Information."
- 4. Tap "Confirm MAC Address." Your system's MAC Address will be displayed on the screen.

Amazon Echo

- 1. Download the Amazon Alexa app to your phone or computer and sign in with your Amazon account.
- 2. Connect to the wireless network transmitted by your Echo device.
